Community Grant Guidelines

Supporting education and employment initiatives to build economic participation, educational outcomes and social cohesion in Melbourne's northwest.

Melbourne Airport currently supports more than 20,000 jobs, which is forecast to grow to more than 35,000 by 2038. We're keen to enable local community members to share in this growth, and to be empowered to contribute fully to the community in which we live and work.

Melbourne Airport appreciates the existing infrastructure and knowledge of local Neighbourhood Houses in responding to the specific educational and employment needs of their communities.

10 x \$10,000 Grants.

These grants are designed to enable Neighbourhood Houses to do more of the projects that their communities are calling out for – with a particular focus on strengthening employment pathways and educational outcomes. The 2020 grant round will open on 13 April, with \$100,000 being provided.

Who can apply?

- Neighbourhood Houses named within the eligible houses list can apply.
- DGR1 status organisations, or those who apply under the auspice of the Australian Neighbourhood Houses and Centres Association Public Fund for DGR.

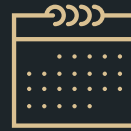


What sort of projects are Melbourne Airport funding?

Educational and/or employment pathways projects or activities that:

- Are responsive to the contemporary needs and reflect the cultural makeup of their local communities.
- Benefit culturally and linguistically diverse or newly arrived migrant communities.
- Have a proven track record and outcomes.
- Can articulate how they are increasing social cohesion, engagement, economic participation and educational outcomes.
- Have strong partnerships with complementary organisations where possible.
- Can demonstrate an investment in forward planning.
- Are not already fully funded by existing government funding streams.

- Up to two applications per organisation per grant round
- Projects reapplying after being funded through a previous round (Additional funding is not guaranteed and all reporting requirements must be up to date)
- Projects that utilise this funding over a period of up to 2 years.



Melbourne Airport is not open to funding:

- Projects at the pilot stage
- Approaches that are untested
- Projects that duplicate an existing offering
- General operating support
- Capital expenditure
- Professional development
- Political or faith-based activities.
